Phonics

Say the sound that your grown-up points to on the phonics sheet. How many can you do in 1 minute?

Can you teach your grown-up our rhymes to help us remember the sounds? (EG: OR corn for the horse).

Your grown up says a sound. How quick can you point to it on the phonics sheet?

Choose a sound. Can you find 5 things around the house with that sound in?

Ask your grown-up to write you some words (EG; park, moon, fork), can you add sound buttons, read them and draw a matching picture? You may be able to write the words and challenge your grown ups to add the sound buttons and draw.

Play bingo with your family! Everyone writes down 6 sounds from the phonics sheet, someone calls out a sound and whoever has that sound crosses it off. Who is the first to cross off all of their sounds?

Write some sounds on pieces of paper, can you rearrange them to make words?

Maths

We are looking at 3D shapes this half term... Can you find 3D shapes around the house and outside? Can you tell your grown ups the names of these shapes? Can you make a structure using 3D shapes? Boxes and toilet roll tubes are great!

We are also exploring doubles facts... Can you double a number of objects (socks, spoons, leaves) I wonder what is the largest number you can get to?

In the classroom we have been using open and closed counting to figure out if a number is odd or even. We use our arms to see if we can or cannot share a number. Find some objects and work out if the number is odd or even, can you spot a pattern?

Number bonds are also very important in F2, we have been looking at bonds to 5 and 10. Can you make these numbers using two groups of objects? 4 leaves and 6 rocks... make this as fun and creative as you can 😊

Writing

As discussed at parents evening, we are having a big push on sentence writing.

These must have a capital letter, full stop and make sense.

I wonder if you can write a sentence about what you have got up to over the weekend.

The children are very good at writing 'I can see' sentences. It would be great to hear what you have seen over the weekend!

Pictures to match the sentence help keep writing fun.
