Can you make a tally chart? You could record different colour cars that pass you or your family & friends favourite animals.	Practise telling the time on an analogue clock. Remember big hand first (count in 5s) then look at the small hand.	Go on a walk and create a map of your route.	Visit the library and borrow a book about our new topic. Bring it in to show us!
Can you sketch a pirate? Can you use dark and light lines, the same way we did to draw African animals?	Write a diary entry about 'the day in the life of a pirate'.	Can you research a famous pirate and create a fact file all about them?	Can you create some of your own $2d + 2d$ or $2d - 2d$ number sentences and use your drawing to work them out.
